



# THE ANGLICAN CENTRE IN ROME

## Financial Needs and Opportunities Summary

Areas of Development for the Centre	Annual funding	Endowment
<p><b>Promoting Christian education, leadership, pilgrimage and action</b></p> <p>In order to deliver the Centre’s ambitious programme of activities, we have created the role of Associate Director who supports the Director in his growing workload, by managing the day to day internal life of the Centre, welcoming visitors, arranging educational programmes, supporting sabbatical students and overseeing Worship. To secure this role for the future requires an annual income of £70,000.</p> <p>The recent renewed optimism in ecumenical relations and growth in interest in the Centre, have also led to an increased work-load for the administrative staff. We anticipate that this work will increase further. We have appointed a full time Centre Manager with a part time assistant and we wish to increase the hours of the assistant to full time. To secure these additional costs the Centre needs an annual income of £30,000.</p>	£100,000	£2,500,000
<p><b>Maintaining a presence in Rome</b></p> <p>To maintain the Centre’s presence in Rome and to cover costs relating to the premises – principally the lease, premises maintenance and utilities, the Centre needs an annual income of £70,000.</p>	£70,000	£1,750,000
<p><b>Conserving and developing the John Moorman Library</b></p> <p>With 15,000 volumes, the Centre currently has the largest library on Anglicanism (its history, faith, liturgy, spirituality and ecumenism), in mainland Europe. We are committed to keeping the library up to date with new acquisitions, conserving its priceless collections for future generations, incorporating new forms of media, making the library better known and more accessible. To maintain and enhance the library, and pay for the part-time librarian, the Centre needs an annual income of £20,000.</p>	£20,000	£500,000
<p><b>St Augustine’s Chapel</b></p> <p>At the heart of the Centre’s life is the small Chapel dedicated to St Augustine. To secure the Centre’s ministry of Worship through the Chapel, the Centre needs an annual income of £2,000.</p>	£2,000	£50,000
<p><b>Inspiring future generations of Church leaders</b></p> <p>By offering bursaries for our courses to younger, emerging leaders from those Provinces of the Anglican Communion which are not currently in a position to provide funding, we aim to enhance the life of the Centre, develop understanding between the Anglican Communion, the Roman Catholic Church and the world-wide Church, helping to create bonds between the various traditions within the Anglican Communion, ecumenically and internationally.
